

Systematic research on polar expedition and work groups were commenced in the 20th century during the 1956-1957 International Geophysical Year



1978/80 – winter-over combined with research work in the Henryk Arctowski Polish Antarctic Station


# Polar stations are so-called analog environments for international space station and interplanetary missions

### Isolated – Confined – Extreme (ICE)

### Create a complete research model, taking into account all factors that affect the behavior of people in ICE





What is more, physiological variables should be added to the model



Reliable psychological measurements should be repeated often, this can be gite inconvenient for the respondents





Although international cooperation is desirable, we are beginning to deal with the paradox: 5 teams of scientists are planning to investigate a group of 10 people



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Participation in psychological research must be voluntary

There is a high risk of weakening the motivation of the respondents over a year, and there is no possibility of *"*recollecting the sample"

The current expedition will probably not get profit from participation in the research project, resoults will be vital for participants of the expeditions in a few years – postponed gratification may weaken the motivation to participate in research

# Is there any hope for polar psychology researches?

An interinstitutioal collaboration

**One international psychological research programme** 

**One international database of research scores** 

Information about the psychological program should be provided during the recruitment process, the organizers of the expeditions should encourage the polarmen to participate in the research

Research should take place through the application, and the psychologist should visit the station personally
